An objection is raised to the proposed designation of land to the south of 26 Church Street and Rectory Farm, Great Shelford as a Protected Village Amenity Area (PVAA).

The designation of this land, in association with a wider area, as a PVAA has been objected to previously and most recently during the South Cambridgeshire District Council's Local Plan Issues and Option 2 Report: Part 2 - South Cambridgeshire Further Site Options consultation in February 2013.

A Landscape and Townscape Assessment was submitted with these previous representations and, whilst this report relates to a larger area than is being objected to in this instance, the report remains relevant, setting out further information regarding the inappropriate nature of this designation and is therefore also attached to this objection.

The area to which this objection relates is not within the Green Belt and lies within the Development Framework of Great Shelford. The area is offered increased protection from inappropriate development or the loss of trees by virtue of it being within the Great Shelford Conservation Area.

In addition to this there is also a Grade II* Listed Building, Rectory Farmhouse, and a Grade II Listed Building No. 24 Church Street, within the vicinity of this area. Therefore the preservation of the setting of both of these listed buildings also increases the protection offered to the character of this area.

The Landscape and Townscape Assessment notes that, with the exception of a number of mature trees, there are no other significant landscape features within the area and it is therefore of little notable landscape or visual value and does little to impact upon the setting of the village.

The attached report also provides an assessment of the area against the criteria for the designation of a PVAA, which it is considered this area does not meet.

Objection (as currently proposed) re the LGS (NH/12 - 038)

All the fields/meadows and orchards/open spaces within the Comberton current PVAA need to be given the maximum protection against development please.

Not 'just' the currently proposed LGS site. We own the larger part of this proposed LGS and we are really not sure why the PC did not discuss this with us before proposing this LGS, and we have only recently become aware about this proposed LGS issue at all (thanks to Caroline Hunt's recent letter to us about this matter).

The still pink PVAA section at the north east of the site is where the local badgers have moved back to live in recent years - after maybe 100 years of absence at this location. As this enclosure field area has always traditionally been called Brocks Close it is fitting and great that they have moved back to this locality.

They need substantial grassland areas for foraging - not least, to avoid having to go out onto the main road more than is necessary. And the size of the currently proposed LGS is inadequate. As long as the rest of the PVAA remains equally well protected, maybe that is sufficient, but in which case, one wonders what the point of the new designation is.

Their sett is partly within the proposed LGS and partly in the PVAA part at the north east corner of the proposed site. And they range far and wide over the PVAA fields and orchards. At least the whole of their clan's home here should perhaps be equally protected within the same designation - rather than spanning two different designations.

The whole of the sett complex is within the current PVAA.

But, if this LGS were to be adopted, as it is currently proposed, half of the sett would be in the PVAA and half in the LGS.

If both designations are in practice equally protected, maybe that does not matter. But we do fear that this new LGS designation over only part of the current PVAA, may (either by design or in effect and in practice) make the PVAA less protected. So if a LGS is to be established, maybe the full sett should come under a LGS designation.

If both designations are in practice equally protected, one wonders what the point of the new designation is ... and for the last decades, the PVAA has pretty well done its job. And the risk may be that by adding a new designation, this may make the PVAA less protected. Hopefully that would not be the case. If landowners see that they are within the less protected PVAA, they could be tempted to clear a site and make an application, whereas if they were in the more protected designation, they might not clear a site and the damage to the wildlife would be avoided. It is really not clear what the thinking is re this new LGS designation - as opposed to PVAA status.

****Preferably, please amend the LGS proposal so that at least all of the fields and meadows and orchards within the current PVAA become LGS designated.... plus, at least, the very wild and overgrown smaller PVAA bit of land at the north east corner of the proposed Comberton LGS (where the local badgers are based and live).**

See the yellow circle on the attached LGS Plan 2.

****Also, after 50 years of absence from the village and at this immediate location, (and in some ways this is even more special), at last, barn owls are moving back and using the boxes here. And it would be wonderful if these beautiful birds were given the maximum chance to really do well here.**

Both these species need and would benefit from having ALL of the fields/meadows and orchards and open spaces within the currently adopted PVAA protected (with as much certainty as possible)...for foraging and hunting. Much of the wider and more intensively farmed land outside the village is not so good for vole habitat, and the more protected land within the village, the better the chance of being able to enjoy and see these lovely birds in the heart of the village. And as there are many other reasons to

avoid more pressure to build in this village, please help to give this wildlife as much assistance and encouragement as possible here.

And the preserved fields meadows orchards and garden areas give sanctuary to many other species such as tawny and little owls, the various woodpeckers, jays, pheasants. blackcaps, chiffchaffs, even the odd rare yellow-browed warbler, garden warblers and the cute long tailed tits and goldfinches and so on . Song thrushes, dunnocks , house sparrows, bullfinches are some of the species that are now more at risk than they used to be are present here. Once common Kestrels also have lived here (see one of the attached photos) and raised young here in recent years in one of the boxes.

Please give maximum protection to ALL of the fields and meadows and orchards and open spaces in this central precious and still preserved current PVAA green part of the village.

The LGS designation may confuse the issue unless all of the current PVAA fields/meadows and orchards in this central green lung part of the village are equally protected.

At various times over the last 50 years this central green slice through the village has been referred to as a green wedge and a green corridor... and the whole of the central green PVAA part of the village could be more spoken of as a green lung.... so we are not sure why the PC speaks of the green lung and then only proposed this narrower green 'corridor' rather than the fuller green lung or heart - as is provided by the full current PVAA area.

**Leaving Comberton as a group village is also important - and connected - re pressure to find possible sites for up to 30 houses at a time.

No gas supply (re CO2 emissions etc.) , already too much traffic and parking problems making exiting from the crossroads and Swaynes Lane dangerous at times, still drainage and sewerage problems that still require endless streams of tankers emptying sewage day and night during wet periods (causing through-the-night disturbance and mashed verges etc.).

*** If this LGS is to come about, we also ask that its boundary (at the south east corner of this proposed LGS site) be amended ... so that the already concreted and brown-field parts of that corner of the proposed LGS (old goat houses and sheds, tractor area etc. and a large static caravan that has been there for over 40 years, oil tank areas and other cluttered areas) are taken out of the proposed LGS designation and some bits that are still fully green and wooded (that have not been included within the proposed LGS area) are put into the LGS designation.

Re LGS Plan 3, please remove the yellow-edged sections from the proposed LGS and put the red and blue sections into the proposed LGS. There is a fine oak tree in the green bit which is in between the two yellow sections on the attached LGS Plan 3 and while it would be protected in any case, there seems some logic to leaving that just inside the LGS boundary.

The somewhat illogical and oddly delineated boundary at the south east corner of this currently proposed LGS has come about due to a combination of unclear hatching on the original Parish Council's LGS submission, (which made it difficult for Scamb's to interpret the hatching marks on the PC's plan, particularly at that point) particularly, and I guess, this difficulty was exacerbated by the scanning process not replicating the hatching clearly.

And with yet more confusion being caused by the PC's use of a very out of date OS base plan (for their LGS submission) (out of date in some key respects)... and then by South Cambs trying to interpret and replicate the PC's hatching onto a different base map which was more up to date but out of date and inaccurate nonetheless.

One of the proposed LGS boundary lines in this south east corner of the proposed LGS site has been drawn to follow some completely out of date old boundary lines that for some reason still show on the OS base map... Lines that are not at all relevant or useful for demarcating the proposed LGS. They do not any more represent features or fences or boundary lines, yet have been used to form some of the rather randomly proposed or interpreted LGS boundary lines. And the public footpath (FP5) lines shown on the base maps that have been used are also completely out of date and those lines have also been used to form the boundary of another part of

	<p>the proposed LGS at that point... The same base maps do not show the 61 Swaynes Lane footprint as it has been for some decades now...
