## Request 8202 – Letter against lockdowns

I hereby submit this 'Letter Against Lockdowns' to the South Cambridgeshire local authority record. I give full consent for the fact of receipt of this 'Letter Against Lockdowns' by the local authority to be made public and freely available information online as one of an accumulated total.

This letter signifies the withdrawal of my consent for any lockdown measures to be voted for on my behalf by any of my elected representatives, from the local up to the national level, which involves the criminalisation or de facto removal of:

- 1. Freedom of assembly
- 2. Freedom to conduct business
- 3. The right to family life and entire family gatherings
- 4. Voluntary consent to medical treatment, including:

a. The legalisation of enforced removal, isolation and testing if 'asymptomatic' or identified as 'potentially infectious'

b. The coercive use of medical treatment as a condition for access to or exit from government services or private business, such as the mandating of tests or vaccines and digital health passports for travel or viewing live sport.

As part of the submission of this letter, under the Freedom Of Information Act, I request that you provide me with the total number of individual 'Letters Against Lockdowns' you have received from constituents of this local authority only, verified by name, address and email registration on the local authority website, including this letter or starting with this letter if this is the first.
