

Small changes make a big difference


Washable Nappy Discount Scheme launched.

We're pleased to be part of a new discount scheme to help families make the switch to washable nappies and wipes.

This is thanks to RECAP; the Recycling In Cambridgeshire and Peterborough waste partnership.

In South Cambridgeshire, each baby wearing disposable nappies contributes around 2.5 tonnes to landfill waste (over the total period of use). Using a washable nappy for just one nappy change a day would cut that by half a tonne!

Modern washable nappies are easy to use and wash and save families an average of £400 a year compared to disposables.



Have you joined the refill revolution?

In the summer issue of the magazine we highlighted steps we can take to reduce waste we generate, before we even start recycling including refilling containers with what you need, instead of buying goods in new packaging.



Support at home

One in four women - and one in six men - will experience domestic abuse during their lifetime

We're working across the Council to make sure we can support you if it happens to you.

What does domestic abuse look like?

Some examples of domestic abuse from national helpline, Refuge, include:

- · Having to change your behaviour when your partner is around out of fear
- Your partner being jealous and possessive
- Feeling like you're walking on eggshells
- Feeling controlled, or isolated.

Police in England and Wales receive over 100 calls relating to domestic abuse every hour. Yet, only an estimated 18% of women who experienced domestic abuse by a partner in the last 12 months reported it to the police.

We're working towards accreditation with the Domestic Abuse Housing Alliance (DAHA) to make sure we're doing everything we can to help residents at risk of, or experiencing, domestic abuse.

In time, this should mean that if you need to contact us for any reason, our colleagues will have the knowledge and skills to be able to support you in your situation.

Domestic abuse can happen to anyone, regardless of age, background, gender, religion, sexuality or ethnicity.

Are you at risk of eviction?

If you live in a privately rented property or a social tenancy and are at risk of eviction, contact us as soon as possible so we can help.

Evictions were banned in the private rented sector throughout the pandemic, but the ban was lifted on 31 May 2021, meaning many people may be facing eviction.

Whether you rent privately or have a social tenancy, if you've received an eviction notice, contact us early. Our Housing Advisors can:

- Help prevent homelessness, in many cases, by negotiating with your landlord or supporting you to secure alternative accommodation
- Support you to address rent arrears and advise whether your landlord's notice is valid
- · Ensure you can access Benefits and debt advice

a helping hand for all ages

Over half of all villages across South Cambridgeshire now have access to a community warden (also known as a mobile warden).

The community warden service is either provided by a village group or by the charity Age UK. It is not a new service and existed long before the pandemic. It is in place to provide day-to-day support and is a lifeline for people who may live alone and not speak to another person regularly.

There is often a misconception that it's only available for older people - but that's not the case.

People under the age of 65 can access the scheme too if they need support to live independently. Support can be short term to help in recovery and reconnecting with the outside world; such as hospital discharge or illness where you

need some daily support whilst you get back on your feet. Or, in the longer term, the service can give peace of mind that someone knows you, can connect you to essential services, and can be there to assist with daily tasks that can seem overwhelming at times.

The Community Warden scheme is available to you if you require additional support to help you maintain independence and continue to live in your home and community. A small weekly fee applies to anyone who receives assistance.

Are you looking for more peace of mind at home?

If you live on your own or someone in your family lives alone, and you would like peace of mind knowing that help is at hand if it's needed, a Lifeline can help.

In case of emergency, a worn pendant connects you with a contact centre. The contact centre will call someone in your family, a friend, a neighbour, or the emergency services. So, if something happens and you can't get to the phone, help will still be available at the touch of a button.

The Enhanced Response Service operating in South Cambridgeshire is for non-medical emergencies; if you fall and are unable to get up, they will be called to help you. Peace of mind for under £4.50 a week (plus £30 installation).

Don't lose your voice

Register to make sure you can vote in 2022

Over the last few months, we have written to every home in South Cambridgeshire, listing the people currently registered to vote in each home.

It's important for each household to take the time to review this information and update us with the details of any changes.

Some of the letters require confirmation that the information we hold remains accurate. If we have asked you to respond, please do so as soon as possible. If we don't get a response, one of our canvassers will visit your home in October or November.

Making sure you are on the electoral register now will also help to ensure you can vote in District Council and Parish Council elections next year, and you will also find it easier to get approved for credit, such as applying for mortgages or even mobile phone contracts.

Making the Council chamber virtual

The pandemic meant many Council services - including Council and committee meetings - had to take place virtually, as people stayed at home and were asked to work from home wherever possible.

As Government restrictions ended we chose to continue live-streaming Council meetings as much as possible, to keep people safe, but also to support our communities' participation in Council business.

Now, residents who don't have access to a car or public transport or don't have the time to travel to the Council's office in Cambourne are able to watch meetings from the comfort of their home, as long as they have a computer, tablet or smartphone.

Liz Watts. South Cambridgeshire District Council's Chief Executive, said: "The pandemic meant we had to change overnight the way the Council worked, and we have seen real benefit in live-streaming Council meetings. We have made the decision to continue to live-stream meetings for our residents, providing additional opportunities for everyone to participate."



Healthy You is running free school and community-based nutrition and physical health activities.

Healthy You for Schools forms part of the new integrated lifestyles service, and is comprised of lesson plans, videos and activities to support young people to understand the importance of making healthy choices.

The focus of the activities is food education and physical activity, and there are a number of ways to get involved.

Public art comes to the Science Park

In June, a new piece of public art was unveiled at Cambridge Science Park.

Latent Facade covers two sides of one of the new Science Park buildings, and was created by internationally renowned artist Jason Bruges. The installation was a condition attached to the planning consent for two new buildings at the Milton Road entrance.

The artwork is made up of two large LED screens; one screen faces Milton Road and the other screen faces the Guided Busway. The LED screen responds, in real time, to physical motion at the Science Park. Latent Façade was inspired by Cambridge

58 school children from the Grove Primary School, who contributed to the images the screens capture by giving their views to the artist about the proposals, were able to attend the launch event. The children's own drawings were also exhibited at the event.

Frequently Asked Questions: Planning

Planning scrapbook

Why do we need to plan for more homes?

People need homes to live in, and the Government is committed to increasing housing supply.

The relationship between planning authorities and Government is complex but councils must plan for new homes to meet needs arising from population and economic growth. If councils don't, their Local Plans (which help control new development) may be found unsound, meaning they can't come into force.

Local Plans are developed by councils in consultation with

local residents and businesses. They set out how much housing should be built, where, and what supporting infrastructure is needed.

Government monitors the progress of adopted Local Plans by applying a Housing Delivery Test and a 'Five-Year Housing Land Supply' metric, which checks councils have enough homes with planning permission or under construction to meet targets in the Local Plan. Failing to meet targets can result in development decisions being taken away from councils.

How much say does Greater Cambridge Shared Planning have over large infrastructure projects?

Projects like East West Rail are Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects; effectively, this means Government makes the final decision. As the Local Planning Authority, we can submit comments and representations during consultations (as can other consultees and interested parties), and these are assessed alongside the comments of others, usually by a Government Planning Inspector.

What roles do the different local authorities have in terms of planning?

Cambridgeshire County Council

County Councils have strategic responsibility for education, waste, transport and some community infrastructure, and can make planning decisions on waste, transport and education related proposals.

Greater Cambridge Shared Planning (GCSP)

South Cambridgeshire District Council and Cambridge City Council brought their planning teams together to create a shared planning team for Greater Cambridge. GCSP is tasked with deciding planning applications in our area. Some decisions are made under delegated powers by planning officers, based on policies set by the councils; some are taken by Planning Committees, made up of elected councillors. GCSP also prepares the Local Plan for the councils that sets out the long-term strategy for the area's development, based on evidence and projections for economic growth and housing need as well as technical studies into a wide range of environmental matters. The next Greater Cambridge Local Plan is under development.

Parish councils

Parish councils are consulted during the Local Plan development process and then on individual planning applications in their parish. As with any comments received on an application, comments from parish councils are considered on their planning merits and against other planning considerations and policies. Parish councils do not decide whether planning permission is granted but their views are given due weight.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership

The Greater Cambridge Partnership (comprising representatives from Cambridge City Council, South Cambridgeshire District Council, Cambridgeshire County Council and the University of Cambridge) does not have any powers in terms of deciding planning applications. It was set up to deliver the 'City Deal', which would see up to £500 million of infrastructure investment (mainly transport).

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority and Mayor

The Combined Authority is not a planning authority but was given the power to develop a Non-Statutory Spatial Framework and is in charge of certain infrastructure investments as well as housing; but the Combined Authority and Mayor have no powers to decide planning applications.

Swift conservation in South Cambridgeshire

Did you know that swifts visit the UK in the summer to breed, but spend winter in Africa? However, data from the British Trust for Ornithology suggests there has been a dramatic decline in the UK swift population in recent decades, partly due to a lack of nesting places; the cavities they have often used are now missing from our better-insulated homes. Our Planning Service provided grant funding to the Over and Swavesey Swift Conservation Project, with local residents John Stimpson and Dick Newell working to address the issue. The project has created and fitted thousands of handmade swift nest boxes for local homes already, and we're now seeing swifts returning to nest in South Cambridgeshire!

Celebrating our RTPI Jubilee Cup win – in person

Planning officers who worked on the Marmalade Lane cohousing scheme in Orchard Park were finally able to celebrate, in person, winning the prestigious Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI) Jubilee Cup. The Service was also awarded the Excellence in Planning for Health and Wellbeing Award; and the Excellence in Planning to deliver Small Schemes Award. The project's Planning Officers were presented with the Cup as lockdown restrictions eased.

First Paragraph 79 house approved

Our Planning Committee approved the District's first ever 'Paragraph 79' house in May 2021.

The National Planning Policy Framework Paragraph 79 bar is very high, requiring houses in the open countryside (outside the development framework) to be truly outstanding or highly innovative.

The architecture of the new house (artist's impression pictured above right), near Fowlmere, responds to the natural context and will be highly sustainable.



High Streets team passes milestone of 1,000 visits and enquiries

A team we set up to help South Cambridgeshire's businesses re-open safely has passed the milestone of 1,000 interactions with local traders in a year.

Our Reopening High Streets Safely Team was established in July 2020 to support local small to medium sized businesses recover and reopen.

Between July 2020 and July 2021, the small team of three officers visited around 700 businesses to provide them with face-to-face advice, and dealt with more than 300 enquiries, concerns and queries that came into the Council. Whether providing banners, signage and stickers to help promote a "Shop local, stay safe" message, assisting with COVID-19 risk assessments, clarifying rapidly changing guidelines or offering advice on cleaning, the team has provided a wide range of support during the past year – all aimed at keeping customers and staff safe.

Since legal restrictions eased, the team's High Street Business Support Officers have been continuing to carry out supportive visits and gathering information on what COVID-19 measures businesses are keeping in place to help reassure shoppers.

Between late July and early August 2021, the team visited almost 130 businesses, around half of which stated that they are keeping all existing COVID-secure measures in place; approximately 40% said that they are keeping some measures in place; and just 4% said that they are not keeping any measures in place.

Our Lead Cabinet Member for Business Recovery and Skills, Cllr Peter McDonald. said:

"It's reassuring to know via our survey of businesses that the vast majority are keeping some form of COVID-secure measures in place to keep customers and staff safe. We know COVID hasn't gone away so this is peace of mind for all of us. I'm extremely proud of the work our Reopening High Streets Safely Team has done.

COVID business support

The scheme is run by our Reopening High Streets Safely team, which was established in spring 2020 with European Regional Development Fund funding aimed at helping High Street businesses to safely reopen their doors after the first lockdown.

Would you know how to access a foodbank?

Support for South Cambridgeshire residents facing hardship.

To ease some of the most immediate financial pressures of the pandemic on individuals and families, Cambridge City Foodbank has been distributing emergency food parcels in Northstowe and Cambourne.

This is alongside running seven foodbank centres locally (across Arbury, Cambridge city, Chesterton and Trumpington), plus a Fairbite shop in Arbury, which offers people the opportunity to access a wide selection of foods for a small membership fee.

If you need the support of a foodbank, please read on to see how to access this – the team wants to help everyone who is struggling to balance financial pressures and could do with a hand.

Meet Lucy, who is here to help

Who can refer a resident for a foodbank voucher?

The foodbank team works with local referral agencies which can issue vouchers to enable people to access the foodbank's services. The process is quick and easy, and local referral agencies include:

Once you have your voucher, you can visit the foodbank to pick up three days' worth of food, which includes: cereal, milk, juice, meat, fish, vegetarian options, pasta, rice, puddings, biscuits, tea, coffee, fruit and veg when available, and toiletries, as well as pet food if needed.

When you arrive, you will be welcomed by one of the foodbank's friendly volunteers and offered a tea or coffee and, if appropriate, volunteers can also point you in the direction of additional sources of help and advice, depending on your circumstances.

The cost of fraud and how you can help tackle it


It's estimated that public sector fraud is costing each household approximately £2,000 a year*

Tenancy fraud: this is when someone doesn't subletting it.

Right To Buy fraud: this is when a household or person receiving the Right to Buy discount, and given an opportunity to buy their property, has falsified information, doesn't actually live at the property, sublets it, or is looking to sell it on before they are permitted to.

What are we doing to combat this?

We have a dedicated Corporate Fraud Team that works closely with other teams in the Council to combat fraud. The team gathers evidence and works to prosecute anyone found to be fraudulently obtaining funds they shouldn't be.



Safety measures

- Keep windows and doors open to allow air to circulate
- Face masks are advised for social gatherings
- Maintain social distancing where possible
- Give way to people entering and exiting through doorways and in and out of toilets
- Cover food and drink and do not leave food out on tables
- · If you are unwell, stay at home and inform your sheltered estate officer.

What next for our COVID community groups?

Back in March 2020, many volunteers and community groups rose to the challenge of establishing or becoming **COVID** community groups.

The groups were able to support people in their local area who had to self-isolate or were asked to shield. As restrictions eased our Communities team has been holding focus groups asking participants whether they would like to continue beyond the pandemic.

Many were keen to build on the positives that have come from the past 17 months, to support communities in a range of areas, such as: supporting vulnerable groups, enhancing health and wellbeing, protecting the climate and environment, building community safety and community resilience, and emergency planning.

We will support communities through post-COVID recovery using revised and improved Community Action Planning, website toolkits and signposting. This will allow communities to build on work done during the pandemic, maintain resilience, and establish working methods to suit individual communities.

The Coffee Pot, Fen Ditton

"I came here today not knowing anyone, I'll be leaving knowing everyone!"

Why does licensing matter?

Licensing helps to keep customers safe across the District.

Our Licensing department processes a wide range of permits and licences, with Private Hire and Hackney Carriage licences being the most frequent.

Do you know how to keep safe in a taxi?

To keep yourself or your loved ones safe, one key thing to check before getting in a cab is whether it is a Private Hire or Hackney Carriage

- Private Hire vehicles must be pre-booked with a licensed Private Hire Operator before you get in - otherwise you are not insured for the journey. Private Hire vehicles have a vellow identification plate which is fixed to the rear of the vehicle (in addition to the number plate that all cars have). Most taxis are Private Hire vehicles, so you should not take a taxi unless you have pre-booked it, except for...
- Hackney Carriages, which have a white identification plate which is fixed to the rear of the vehicle. Hackney Carriages can be flagged down in the street because they have the correct licence and safety measures in place for this type of journey.

How does checking a taxi licence keep you safe?

Drivers and vehicles have to meet certain criteria to qualify for a licence. An unlicensed driver or vehicle will not have undergone the same checks, will not have the appropriate measures in place to safeguard passengers, and would not be insured for your journey, meaning you are much less protected if something should go wrong.

Licensed drivers must:

have a criminal record check and subscribe to an update service so their status can be verified throughout their licence period

undertake safeguarding and competency tests

be subject to a penalty points scheme, with repeat offenders referred to the Council's Licensing Committee

licence expiry date.



> display a door sign and the right colour plate on the rear of the car (yellow for Private Hire pre-bookable cars, or white for Hackney Carriages which you can jump into). The plates show the South Cambridgeshire District Council logo; the make, model, registration of the car; and expiry date of the licence.

(Some hire cars – executive hire or chauffeur services - are exempt from displaying plates, but must carry an exemption notice.)

If you are in any doubt about the validity of a licence, ask to see the driver's ID, take a note of the date, time and the car's number plate, and email taxis@scambs.gov.uk for confirmation. Our Enforcement Officers check drivers are adhering to licence conditions.

New communities

New partnership's plan for green homes at Cambourne **Business Park**

We have come together with Hill Group to form a unique 50/50 joint venture partnership to deliver new local, environmentally-friendly housing, creating places where people want to be.

The South Cambridge Investment Partnership (SCIP) will build homes and supporting facilities like cafés, parks and play areas, without drawing on any existing Council assets or landbanks, breathing fresh new life into areas currently sitting empty.

The Partnership's first site was acquired in May on Cambourne Business Park and looks set to revive the stalled development of the Business Park. The land has the potential to deliver 275

new homes, 40% of which will be affordable (110 homes) and will place the environment at its heart. The development will be entirely gas-free, with air source heat pumps fitted in every home, alongside highly water-efficient technology to reduce water consumption.

Externally, the landscaping plans include new trees, hedges, wildflowers and a wetland, with the existing woodland site retained. The target is for the affordable properties to achieve a fully netzero carbon standard.

Shape the future of the **OxCam Arc**

A digital consultation, being run by the Government until 12 October, aims to help shape the future of the OxCam Arc.

The Oxford-Cambridge Arc is the name given by Government to an area designated as being of national economic significance, with the potential to be one of the most prosperous and innovative areas in the world.

South Cambridgeshire is located within this Arc, made up of the counties of Bedfordshire. Buckinghamshire. Cambridgeshire, Oxfordshire and Northamptonshire.

The consultation, which has been taking place through the summer. invites residents and businesses to go online and have their say on the vision for the future of the area. The overall plan of the work, called the Spatial Framework, is to enhance the environment, facilities, links and housing across the whole Arc area.

Comments received in the consultation will help the Government's Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government create the Spatial Framework's vision for the area to 2050. In turn this will help quide local planning and investment decisions in four areas. These are the environment; the economy; connectivity and infrastructure; and place-making.


