A. POLICY, PRACTICE, FUNCTION OR PROJECT TO BE ASSESSED

A1. Please describe what are the main aims, objectives, purpose and intended outcomes of the policy or function?

This Policy sets out South Cambridgeshire District Council's (SCDC) position with regard to waiving or reducing the recovery of the remediation costs associated with owner-occupiers of residential dwellings situated on, or affected by, contaminated land.

The policy is based on the relevant sections of the primary legislation and associated statutory guidance. However, it is recognised that there is likely to be a wide variation in the circumstances associated with land contamination (including its history, ownership and liability for its remediation) therefore the adopted approach is to view nationally published guidance in terms of *principles* and *approaches* rather than rigid rules. This policy defines how these principles and approaches will be interpreted and applied by SCDC.

This policy relates specifically to Class B persons who currently own and reside in property on the land in question but were not responsible for pollution affecting it. The Class B persons may only be held liable for remediation of contamination within the boundary of their property and cannot be held liable for any pollution of controlled waters.

The guidance and this policy place no requirement on the Council to pay for remediation for which it is not liable. This policy is solely intended to set out the framework for considering the reduction or waiving of cost recovery for a Class B owner-occupier.

Contaminated Land Strategy 2001, Enforcement Policy, Debt Recovery Policy, Means Test methodology approved for use in the assessment of applications for Housing Renovation Grants under the Housing Renewal Grants Regulations 1996. Strategic Aims: - a listening council, providing first class services accessible to all; make the district a safe and healthy place for all; a place in which residents can feel proud to live

A3. Who are the intended beneficiaries/stakeholders of the policy or function? How many people are affected and from what sections of the community?

The direct beneficiary will be the Class B Owner Occupier. However it is in the wider public interest to ensure that land is remediated. Numbers affected cannot be quantified at this stage as the application is site specific but will be applicable to resident landowners affected by contamination.

The policy is split into the reasonable/fairness test and the means testing which adopts the principles of the HRA.

Owing to potential costs of remediation a ceiling on the amount to be waived or reduced is not appropriate.


