A. POLICY, PRACTICE, FUNCTION OR PROJECT TO BE ASSESSED

A1. Please describe what are the main aims, objectives, purpose and intended outcomes of the policy or function? The Air Quality Action Plan (AQAP) highlights measures designed to improve air quality in South Cambridgeshire, particularly within its Air Quality Management Area (AQMA), and sets out how we are going to implement and monitor these measures.

A2. Is this policy or function associated with any other Council policy or priority?

The Plan is associated with various other Council policies and priorities, including the Air Quality Strategy, which addresses air quality across the district and not just in poor quality areas. The Plan also links to the Local Development Framework, where policies relating to air quality will be covered within a Supplementary Planning Document. The AQAP also contributes towards meeting the Council Aim of ensuring that South Cambs is a safe and healthy place to live.

A3. Who are the intended beneficiaries/stakeholders of the policy or function? How many people are affected and from what sections of the community?

The intended beneficiaries of the Plan are those residents that live within the boundary of the Air Quality Management Area (including around 100 homes, a school and the Blackwell Traveller Site).

A4. Is the policy/function corporate and far-reaching? The Plan is a joint piece of work by Cambridge City Council and Huntingdonshire District Council with the participation of Cambridgeshire County Council.

A5. Are you expecting to make any significant change to the policy or service in the near future? If so, please give details. The Air Quality Action Plan is a five-year plan with progress due to be reported annually.

A6. Is this a new or existing policy or function?

The AQAP is a new Plan, required by legislation to be adopted within 12-18 months of the Air Quality Management Area Order declared by South Cambridgeshire District Council in July 2008

B. EVIDENCE/ DATA and CONSULTATION

B1. What monitoring or other information do you have about relevant target groups, which will show the impact of the policy or function?

Predominantly it is air quality that is monitored, as legislation dictates the levels that will result in an Air Quality Management Area. However, since the boundaries of the Management Area are clearly defined, we know which of our residents are affected by poor air quality. These residents specifically include the Blackwell Traveller site and the Orchard Park school.

B2. Have you compared the data you have with the equality profile of the local population? What does it show? As noted in B1, a Traveller Site and School are sited within the AQMA, which is the key focus for the AQAP. Under consultation at the moment is the Gypsy and Traveller DPD, which includes a proposal for the Blackwell site to revert to its original status as a transit site. This will mean that residents on site will not be exposed to relevant periods of poor air quality at this location.

B3. Have you identified any improvements or other changes that could be made from monitoring the data? The Council continues to monitor air quality at various places throughout the AQMA. The resulting data is used to model air quality throughout the area, including at the Traveller Site and school.

B4. Have you consulted or involved external stakeholders about the policy or function? If so, what were their views? MRUK were commissioned to carry out some public workshops with a cross section of the community. They also carried out a stakeholder workshop with a variety of members from the involved authorities along with the Highways Agency. Themes from these workshops were similar and tended to focus on issues directed from County level including the guided busway and widening of the A14. They also tended to be focused on the Cambridge City area.

B5. Have you undertaken any consultation with staff to assess their perception of any impacts of the policy or function? If so, what has been learnt from them?

Extensive joint working has taken place between the authorities involved. In addition to this, key officers within SCDC have been consulted over the Plan.

EqIAs from other authorities have been studied.
