

## ■ SITE ACCESS & RIGHTS OF WAY

There are a number of existing walking and cycling routes surrounding and adjoining the site including public rights of way, footways and cycleways.

There is a public byway which links Rampton Drift and Longstanton to the southwest to Rampton in the northeast. This right of way crosses the Cambridgeshire Guided Busway (CGB) and links from Rampton to Histon. A byway links to the northwest via a bridleway routing along Over Road and Ramper Road which accesses Swavesey and the Ouse Valley Way to the northwest. The public byway which routes south of Longstanton runs south towards Bar Hill, but does not provide a crossing over the A14 and as such is limited in terms of its use at the southern end.

Footways are adjacent to the majority of the carriageways throughout the villages of Longstanton and Oakington and these provide part of suitable routes for which to access the proposed development site by foot. There are a number of access points into the site from Longstanton via public rights of way (footpaths, bridleways and byways).
