Harston Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Information Statement

Referendum on the Harston Neighbourhood Plan

A referendum on the 'making' (adoption) of the Harston Neighbourhood Plan will be held on **Thursday 4 September 2025** at **Harston Village Hall, High Street, Harston, CB22 7PX.**

The question that will be asked in the referendum is: "**Do you want South Cambridgeshire District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Harston to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?**"




Figure 1: Map of the Harston Neighbourhood Plan area and referendum area

The referendum area is identified on the map in figure 1 included at the end of this Information Statement. The referendum area is identical to the neighbourhood area designated in June 2022 for the Harston Neighbourhood Plan.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if on 4 September 2025:

- he or she is registered and entitled to vote in local council elections;
- he or she is over 18 years old; and
- his or her qualifying address is in the referendum area (shown at figure 1).

The referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is **£2,446.31**. This figure has been calculated based on the electorate for the specified neighbourhood area as 1 July 2025.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.

The specified documents are available for public viewing on the Harston Neighbourhood Plan page of South Cambridgeshire District Council's <u>website</u>.

The specified documents are:

- the 'Referendum' version of the Harston Neighbourhood Plan, which includes a map of Harston Neighbourhood Plan area;
- the Examiner's Report on the Harston Neighbourhood Plan;
- the written representations on the submission version of the Harston Neighbourhood Plan, that were submitted to the independent examiner;
- South Cambridgeshire District Council's decision statement on the receipt of the Examiner's Report and its decision to proceed to referendum, including a statement of satisfaction that the 'Referendum' version of the Neighbourhood Plan meets the Basic Conditions and is legally compliant; and
- a statement that sets out general information as to town and country planning including neighbourhood planning and the referendum.
