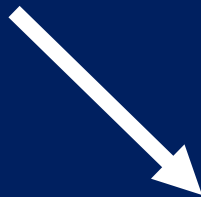
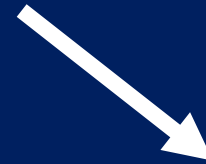
Call to Service

 - T – Threat
 - H - Harm
 - R – Risk
 - I – Investigation
 - V – Vulnerability
 - E – Engagement
- CC = incident reference
- 35/ = investigation reference

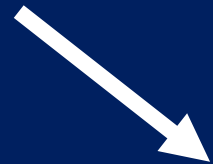
Dispatch

- Immediate – within 15 minutes
- Priority – within 1 hour
- Prompt – within 3 hours
- Schedule – within 3 days
- Appointment – agreed date / time
- RVR – Rapid Video Response
- No response



IMU

- Appropriate investigation raised
- Dependant on what is provided by the informant, it is assessed as 'lines of enquiry' or 'no lines of enquiry'
- No lines of enquiry, the investigation will likely be filed
- Lines of enquiry, the investigation will be allocated
