Summary

The village has a recreation ground with four senior pitches, two mini soccer pitches, Cricket Square, 2 tennis courts and an artificial turf MUGA. There is one play area on the recreation ground and a further four spread across the village. The village also has a purpose built skate-park and informal outdoor basketball area.

Changing facilities are currently provided within the community centre and the Parish Council has plans to provide four changing rooms as part of the redevelopment of the building, to meet the requirements of the football club.

Junior football is very popular in the village. The Colts Club uses the recreation ground and local school pitches and would benefit from an additional mini soccer pitch to cope with local demand. The Club relies heavily on use of the school pitches.

The formal MUGA provides a valuable facility for training, coaching and 5-a-side football and is a venue for sports development initiatives.
