Summary

The village has one recreation ground with two hard tennis courts in good condition, a football pitch and bowls green. A new Sports and Social Pavilion was opened in 2011 which provides better facilities on the Recreation Ground, this project was supported by SCDC with a £30000 grant for the £196000 total project.
