Summary

The village has one recreation ground with a range of youth and play provision, two hard tennis courts in excellent condition, a football pitch and pavilion. The play equipment has been upgraded within the last year and now is split into a range of areas.

2 football teams use the pitch but all are from outside the village - one from Hardwick and one from Eversden.

A Skate park was developed with a grant of \pounds 5810 towards total project cost of \pounds 16599 in 2010/11 and in 2009 a new practise wall was added to the tennis courts, the tennis courts were resurfaced in 2006 at a cost of \pounds 30000.

At the time of inspection the tennis court fencing was being repaired.

The new play area was installed in 2011 and was supported by the Big Lottery.
