### Summary

The village has one recreation ground with a senior football pitch, cricket square, bowls green, two tennis courts and a play area.

The pavilion does not meet the requirements of Comberton Football Club who play in Division 1 as there are inadequate officials changing facilities and consequently requires an extension.

Comberton Crusaders, a thriving youth football club, use the recreation ground on an occasional basis and have to use pitches outside the village, as they require a permanent mini soccer pitch.

Comberton Tennis Club has moved to use the Village College facilities, leaving the village courts for recreational use.

The Parish Council is negotiating the purchase of adjacent farmland to expand the recreation ground to include an additional football pitch, two mini soccer pitches and youth facilities including a skate-park.

Comberton Village College while mainly in the parish of Toft was included in the survey for Comberton. Its proximity to Comberton means that it is more likely to service recreation needs in Comberton.

The Comberton Crusaders feel there is a desperate need for more and better pitches in the village.

The Parish Council consider that the ageing play equipment is in need of improvement. It is hoped that an area of adult fitness/play can be provided. The cost of maintaining and improving these facilities is a concern. The sports pavilion is in need of renovation/extension for which grant funding is being sought.

Storage for sports equipment was provided in 2011 as part of the village hall at a total cost of £7270
